PAUL LINNELL'S CONTACTS ARE OUT OF THIS WORLD

Chatting with high flying space ship crews is a hobby available to few persons in our clan. However, Paul Linnell (118, 241, 231, 124, 2) of West Fargo, ND has been talking with American astronauts and Russian cosmonauts over the past eight years. He uses his ham radio skills to chat with those characters in outer space and to send them computerized messages.

Paul has been active as an amateur radio operator for more than 25 years. It was when he learned that other ham radio operators were establishing contacts with space ships that he opened a whole new enterprise of conversation with their crews.

One of his most satisfying relationships has been the months-long contact he has enjoyed with Sergei Krikalev, a Russian cosmonaut who was kept spinning around the planet seven months longer than his planned trip. Not only did the U.S.S.R. break up as a collective nation, but even the space agency that sent him into orbit was closed down while he was up. Krikalev had to feel abandoned in space for a very long time.

It helped that Paul had taught himself to speak rudimentary Russian; for even though the cosmonaut had a good command of English, the competition among 1500 ham operators seeking his attention in American English offered an advantage to anyone who could open conversation in the cosmonaut's own tongue. Their interchange has been cordial, their topics chiefly personal. Paul reports that he did not attempt to discuss problems of politics nor very many technical questions but separated out problems of government from the common interests of people. It has been, he emphasizes, a person-to-person dialog.

Contacts between Paul and his Russian correspondent were necessarily brief. He had only nine minutes to get on line with Sergei as the space craft circled over the

western United States. Even then, actual discussion time could never exceed two-and-a-half minutes because the lightning-fast space ship was soon beyond reach. Yet into that time, the two men built a continuing relationship that endured until Sergei finally got down from space last spring. They have not exchanged messages recently.

Paul continues his interchanges with other space crews, sending them computer messages and dialoguing with them. He makes it sound easy for others to get into such contact, noting that the federal government now makes it simpler to obtain an amateur radio license, and confiding that AMSAT, an organization of amateur radio operators interested in satellite communication, publish a guide about space flights, schedules and postions.

Paul's call sign is WQ0M; and he notes that there are other Linnell cousins who could hold conversations as several in his immediate family are doing.

Such a pastime could threaten to become as all-consuming hobby; but Paul has a business of his own. He manages a safety consulting firm, continuing the same work he has done for some years when employed by a North Dakota manufacturer. He and his wife, Nancy, are the parents of three children: Jo Dee Paulette, 18; Matthew Paul, 16; and Paula Gail, aged 9.

JUST WHAT DOES "LINNELL" MEAN?

One tradition, among several, holds that the family name Linnell is of Celtic origin and that the key to its meaning is to be found in analyzing the two syllables, "linn" and "el". Because "lynn", with its varient "i" or "y" is translated as the word "lake" and "el" as a hill, this can suggest a lake at the foot of a hill. Just how the name could get attached to people who lived on the lake shore under the hill is hardly mysterious. Etymologists frequently theorize that families acquire names from their locations. Thus the Greenes lived next to the green meadow where the cattle grazed while the Towners had a home in the town itself. It makes sense then to suppose that a family who could be identified by the lake (lynn) and hill (el) become the Linnells.


> In his Pioneer Real Estate business at Portland, Maine, Virgil Linnell has adopted a logo (seen in the illustration) that advances this theory a major step. His information is that "linnell" is Welsh term that means "house by the water". As Welsh is a derivative language fromCeltic origins, this explanation is cogent.

> We can be confident that the name was

known in England long before the emigration of our ancestor, Robert; but it was often spelled Lynnel in those days. Today's English families spell Linnell as we do, or else with the elimination of that final "l" (Linnel). To complicate matters (though we hardly need that) the name of Robert, our original ancestor in this country, is variously spelled in various documents. On his will he signed his name as Robert Linnel. But in the list of the townsmen of Barnstable, according to Freeman's <u>History of Cape Cod</u>, he is listed as Robert Linnet.

One tradition makes the claim that Linnells entered England from France in the Norman invasion of 1066, and that one of our remote ancestors was entrusted with the administration of a section of the conquered territory. His name, as given at that time, was simply spelled Lionel. Still other stories relate that some of our kin migrated to Scandanavia. Indeed some of our family, touring Sweden in 1978, discovered Linnells among the residents of Upsala.

If readers of the FAMILY NEWSLETTER have discovered other variations of the history of our name, they are urged to write to the editors. Through enrichment of our collection of these reports concerning the word, we hope to begin to trace the true story, even with all its variations, and finally establish a definitive version.
