
be difficult to get them back for

Thomas Jefferson Linnell

(118,241,18) By Dan R. McConnell (118,241,186,623)

My first recollections of Linnells were the stories of my grandmother Myrtle Mae Sewell (118,241,186,6) of Belvidere, Illinois. She and her brother Arthur and sister Grace were very interested in family history. Aunt Grace had verified her descent from Joseph Linnell (118,241) and had become a member of the D. A. R. Uncle Art pursued genealogy as a hobby all of his life. All three lived into their 90's and I knew them well. In addition, my great-grandmother Maryette Linnell Sewell lived until 1948 in Belvidere, or until I was eight years old. I heard her first hand stories as well. My great-grandmother Sewell had

Thomas Jefferson Linnell's family Bible, and gave it to Art Thorne. Years later I was able to copy pages from it.

Bits of information from our family may serve to add some detail to the story of Thomas Jefferson Linnell in

Rachel's book (page 337). The family Bible information is the same as the book, with one addition. In the Bible it says that Thomas Jefferson Linnell and Mary Thorne were married at Jonathan Hunter's, who was a neighbor of the Thorns in Barnes Settlement, near Alexandria Bay, Jefferson County. Jonathan Hunter was apparently a Strangite Mormon and came to Illinois the same time as Thomas J. and Mary. This is further indication that Thomas J. may have been an early convert to the Mormon faith. Once in Illinois, however, they spent their life there as Methodists.

According to our family stories, Thomas J. and family "came across the Great Lakes on a flatboat" with their possessions. I have a beautiful hand made three drawer chest which

is supposed to have come from Jefferson County. Family tradition says that they farmed in the eastern part of Winnebago County, near Spring Creek Road rather than living in Rockford which was then a small village. In 1851 they bought a farm in Caledonia Township, Boone County. The farm is still a farm and the original farmhouse was still existing a few years ago. I have pictures from the late 19th century and from twenty years ago of the same farm. It is located where Bell Road dead ends about two miles north of Spring Creek Road in Boone County.

When they retired they moved to Belvidere and lived at 601 East Lincoln Avenue. When my grandparents were married in 1903 they lived with and cared for Thomas J. for several years. My mother, Marjory Maureen Sewell

McConnell was born in 1907 and remembered "old Grandpa Linnell" with white hair rocking on the porch. He died when she was five.



time when bands of roving Indians would stop by at the farm, sometimes working for food. There was never any trouble even though they farmed there only twenty years after the Blackhawk Wars in that area.

According to Thomas J.'s obituary in the Belvidere paper, he was in good health until suffering a bad fall ten weeks before his death. It also said that he farmed until the 1870's when they bought the house in Belvidere.

My grandparents, Charles T. Sewell, the son of Sutton and Maryette Linnell Sewell, and Myrtle Mae Thorne Sewell, daughter of Nathan G. and Jane Linnell Thorne, were both Linnell descendants. Yes, they were cousins.

My grandfather was a college graduate, a bank officer, and a prominent citizen in Belvidere. My grandmother was a founder of the Boone County Historical Society, a reader in the Christian Science Church, and ran the Christian Science bookstore into her 90's. She was a gentle and dignified woman with quite a vocabulary, who worked actively in republican politics. Her son, Howard T. Sewell, (my uncle) was state senator, States Attorney, and County Judge in Boone County. His son, Charlie, is still an attorney in Belvidere.

The Linnells were early settlers in Boone County, Illinois, and contributed much, even though the name Linnell is no longer present there. Its an oddity that until adult life I never met anyone <u>named</u> Linnell even though I grew up with Linnell heritage at every hand.
