Linnell Family Bible To Be Auctioned

Way back in 1837, long before this era of computer files, scanners, and digital cameras, families kept their records between the pages of large, heavy Bibles. Somewhere between the books of Malachi and Matthew, they entered the names of their kin, recording births, marriages, and deaths. With the exact dates and with flourishing script (the fanciest writer of the household was often chosen to record entries) these vital statistics were recorded for future reference.

'Way back in 1837 a printer in Brattleboro, Vermont turned out many such Bibles for sale to households across the eastern United States. One edition contains not only the Old and New Testaments, but also extensive study features: an outline of biblical events, a dictionary of words in the Scriptures, a concordance of subjects (where to find references to "creation," "life," "children," "baking," "dogs," or a lengthy list under "sin").


And 'way back in the 1830s, the descendants of Samuel Linnell (118,241,15) purchased one of these magnificent bibles, places it on their mantle, read its passages to their family, and recorded their names and dates in its massive pages. This Samuel Linnell lived and died in Kilbourne City, Wisconsin, now knows as The Wisconsin Dells and located near Black river Falls. The dimensions of Samuel's bible are approximately 7 by 10 1/2 inches; and it measures 3 1/2 inches thick. It's a hefty book with numerous details about biblical history as well as entries concerning Lewis Linnell, Laura Linnell, and a score of other family names as well.

Some members of the Linnell Family Association are certain to want this venerable, battered Bible, valuable for its historic detail, its references to their family line, and it very patina. Augusta Brown Johnson (118, 241, 154, 51), with her interest in the Linnell genealogy, presented the Bible to Rachel Linnell Wynn, the family historian. The steering

committee of the family association, in turn, will be offering the bible for sale at auction in June at the triennial family reunion at Black River Falls, Wisconsin. Proceeds of the auction will be added to the scholarship fund for our young people. Persons whose genealogical number in The Descendants of Robert Linnell begins with 118 are certain to covet this historic bible; but many others in the clan would wish to own this specimen of history and tradition. Plan now to be present at the auction, to bid for a genuine antique, and to abet the Linnell family scholarship fund.



Samuel Linnell (118,241,15)




The MYSTERY of the LINNELL BELL

Does anyone recognize this beautiful bronze ship's bell? It has the Family Name forged right across the bottom. We know it couldn't have adorned the mast of *Cagle Wing* as she went down with all hands and Capt. Linnell in 1865 on the way to Bombay from Boston - unless the good Captain removed it while some other captain skippered the *Cagle Wing* (Captains Waters [1856], Worth [1858, 1859], and Colby [1860] each replaced Capt. Linnell from time to time).

Or perhaps it adorned one of the Captain's other commands (Flying Mist and Buena Vista). Or did it hang by the entrance of his beautiful home in Orleans, Massachusetts, to call the children to meals? I have not seen it mentioned anywhere, so it's all mere speculation.

The bell itself surfaced recently in central Maine in excellent condition. A wall bracket and wooden mounting stand have been fabricated from brass, Washington spruce, Oregon fir and Maine cedar. The bell has been cleaned and highly polished and hopefully will be on display at Black River Falls this June. Perhaps President Jerry will ring this beautiful Family Heirloom to call to order the 2003 Linnell Family Reunion!
