## **Editorial Comment**

At the Linnell Family Reunion you will be electing a new editor for the newsletter. Kay and I have been the editors of the Linnell Family Newsletter, for quite some time now. Like everything we mortals do, it has been fun, exasperating, entertaining, frustrating, and, above all, a great learning experience. We have tried to be editors of the material submitted to us and have tried not to inject our personal opinions. However, since this will be our last newsletter, I felt it might be appropriate for me to write one article which sums up my feelings on the Association, the Linnell Family, and family history/genealogy in general.

I first became connected to the Linnell Family as a favor to my mother-in-law, Elsie Linnell Thompson. She was extremely proud of her Linnell heritage and, when Rachel Wynn connected her father, Selwin Linnell, back to Robert Linnell, Elsie was delighted. She had long known that this link existed, but never knew exactly who her earlier ancestors were. She wasn't able to travel and so, through us, she vicariously joined in reunions at Massachusetts, Ohio, New York, and Wisconsin. She saw pictures of cousins and of places her ancestors lived, like the farm in Illinois where her grandfather lived and her father grew up. She saw the records of her great-grandfather's service in the war of 1812. And I, through these reunions, made friends with many fine descendants of Robert Linnell.

To be fair to my father-in-law, I also had to research his ancestry, tracing his ancestors from Norway to North Dakota. This led me to research my own roots, tracing my father's ancestors from Sweden to Illinois, and my mother's family from Germany, through Indiana, to Nebraska. And, while finding these roots I also found other family reunions. I have been to a Geisler Family reunion in Indiana and the 100<sup>th</sup> annual Swedberg/Benson Family reunion in Illinois. I have now many friends among cousins from my side of the family to go with those of the Linnells.

# The Linnell Ladies of Saco, Maine

Seated at the front left in this mid-1930s photograph is Sarah Shepherd Linnell, widow of Civil War veteran William F. Linnell (118,241,215). Others are daughters Bertha Roby Linnell (also seated) and Adelaide Paulina Linnell (rear left). Standing at the rear right is Susan Tarbox Linnell, William's daughter by an earlier marriage. All three of the Linnell Daughters dedicated their lives to the teaching profession and not one of them ever married.

Bertha became Associate Professor of Music Theory and Education at Carleton College in Northfield, Minnesota, where she was also Supervisor of Music for the public schools. She died in 1970.

Adelaide became Professor of Music Theory and Education at Mankato State Teachers College in Mankato, Minnesota, where she was also Supervisor of Music in the elementary schools. Adelaide died in 1974.

Susan was for many years an elementary school teacher in Salem, Massachusetts. She was confined to a wheel chair for many years prior to her death in 1960. Each girl attended Thornton Academy in Saco, Maine, where the Linnell Gymnasium, named for their brother, William S. Linnell (118,241,215,2), is located.

### Cape Cod Gravestone Restoration Complete


Your Gravestone Restoration Committee is pleased to report that all tasks assigned to it relative to the deteriorated, broken and missing gravestones of our ancestors on Cape Cod, Massachusetts, have been accomplished.

The barely legible slate stone of RUTH LINNELL in Barnstable's Lathrop Hills Cemetery has been reproduced in granite and was erected at the cemetery in early February.

You will recall that the Committee was formed at the 1997 reunion. Since that time, the gravestones of Jonathan and Elizabeth Linnell in Orleans Cemetery have been duplicated in granite, as have those of John, and now, Ruth at Lathrop Hills. This completes the Committee's assigned tasks and I wish to thank all of you who, through your generosity, have made our efforts such a success.

One or more proposals for additional restorations elsewhere will be presented at the coming reunion in June.



## The William Linnell House

Last November I attended a Mayflower passengers descendants meeting. At that meeting I was given a map of "The first century houses in Barnstable" by a descendant of the Bearse family. One of the houses was the Linnell built in 1710 on Scudder Ave.

The map was drawn by J. W. Gould. I contacted him. He put me in touch with Nancy Shoemaker of W. Barnstable Historical Society. She took a picture of the Linnell house on 326 Scudder Ave., Hyannis Port, and sent it to me.


I next contacted the Barnstable Historical Commission in Barnstable. The sent me a dossier on the house.

The original records that the town had was burned. Nathan Lovell III was born here in his grandfather's homestead in 1783. His daughter Carolyn was born Feb 12,1815. She married May 3, 1838 William Embly Linnell, 118,742,4. William bought the house from Nathan Lovell II.
