And as I have already told you, a motion made by the Chair was UNANIMOUSLY accepted that the next reunion be in the environs of good ol' Grand Marais, MN.

Gosh, the locals are already hard at work dreaming up a most invigorating historical and fashionable reunion to match all reunions. Plan soon, my dear cousins. It's a weekend you will never forget.

# Gravestone Restoration Committee Report

At the recent Linnell Family Association reunion in Rockford, IL, the membership voted to raise funds to have replica gravestones made for Samuel Linnell [118,2] and his wife Hannah Scudder Linnell. So far we have created replacement gravestones for Jonathon Linnell [117] and his wife Elizabeth Linnell, who are buried in the ancient Orleans Cemetery, for John Linnell [118] and his wife Ruth Davis Linnell, who are buried in the Lothrop Hill Cemetery in Barnstable, all on Cape Cod, and most recently, for Samuel Linnell [118,24], who is buried in Belgrade Lakes, ME.

This new project will fill the gap between John Linnell, Samuel's father, and Samuel Linnell, his own son. This Samuel Linnell [118,2] was born 16

November, 1699 in Barnstable, probably in the area now called Hyannis, then called the South Sea. Samuel was a civically active member of the lo-



cal community, serving on grand juries, school committees and various other duties. He died in 1753 and is buried in the front part of the South Street Cemetery in the downtown part of Hyannis, not far from the President John F. Kennedy Library. Until some 15 years ago, the stones were existent and still legible, but were broken and lost in the late 90's.

His wife's family, the Scudders, were very prominent in Massachusetts law and business. One son travelled to San Francisco to found the Scudder Bank a major financial institution to the present day.

We hope that many members of the Linnell family will find it in their heart to contribute to the growing fund for the replacement of these gravestones. We hope to have the project completed by the next reunion in Grand Marais, MN in June, 2012.

## A Friendly Reminder!!!

As 2009 winds down, it is time to start thinking about next year. With the New Year comes the time to renew your <u>Linnell Family Association (LFA) Membership</u> by paying your membership dues.

Included in the newsletter is an insert, "LFA Membership Dues & Contributions". It is provided so you can pay your membership dues, contribute to the Gravestone Restoration or LFA Scholarship Funds, and purchase the book "Descendents of Robert Linnell and/or a LFA golf shirt and/or a copy of the Eagle Wing print by writing just one check to the LFA.

If you're not sure of your current membership status in the LFA or don't remember the last time you paid your membership dues, you can find this information on the mailing label of this newsletter.

Following your name on the mailing label is the information regarding your membership status and the last year, according to LFA records, you paid your membership dues. (See example below)

There are three different levels of membership. After your name you will see your status:

- Single (yourself) \$15 per year,
- <u>Family</u> (you, your spouse, and children living at home) \$25 per year, or
- <u>Lifetime</u> (you have made a one time payment for a lifetime membership) \$125 payment.

Following your status level are two numbers or 'xx'. The number is the last year you paid you membership dues according to the LFA records. If you see 'xx', it means the LFA records are incomplete and do not indicate the last year you paid your membership dues.

Example of mailing label and membership status.

John Doe Linnell Single 09
1111 Happy St.
Any Where, XX 00001

In this example, John Doe Linnell is a "Single" member and last paid in "2009".

Remember, a LFA Membership is a **GREAT GIFT** for that family member who has everything.

# Linnell Family Association Scholarship Fund (LFASF)

We are pleased to invite Linnell family students to apply for award of the Linnell Family Association Scholarship Fund. The Linnell Scholarship Fund was established in 2000 with a donation of \$500 and has continued to grow since then.

### Who can apply?

Any high school senior or current student of a college or an accredited higher education program, who is a descendant of Robert Linnell, is eligible to apply for the scholarship. Student applicants are asked to write an essay on Linnell family history or current positive influences of the Linnell family. The essay should be typed and double-spaced, not less than 1,000 words, nor more than 2,500 words in length. One winning essay will be selected this year for the \$1000 scholarship award.

## How do students apply?

Students should mail their original essay along with: the LFASF Scholarship Application form; two letters of recommendation (one from a teacher of the applicant and one from a member of the applicant's community); and a current academic transcript. Please visit: "linnellfamilyassociation.com" for complete rules, further information about applying for the scholarship award, and scholarship application forms.

### How are the essays judged?

The Linnell Family Association Scholarship Fund Administration Committee (LFASFAC) will oversee the selection and judging of all prospective scholarship award recipients.

### When are essays and applications due?

Students wishing to enter their essay for the **LFASF** award must have their application, accompanying essay, letters of recommendation and transcript postmarked by **April 15, 2010**.




Linnell Family Association funds continue to support our endeavors in communication, reunion, remembrance of ancestors and higher education for our youth.

Consistency in the General Fund balance keeps our operations running smoothly. As the chart illustrates, we have sus-



tained a \$6,000+ balance for several years. Membership dues this year have totaled \$1,070; this includes 5 new life members. Strong sales of the Descendants of Robert Linnell book and additions booklet (\$441) plus Eagle Wing prints (\$517) bolstered the account this year.

Exciting things happened this year with the Scholarship Fund, as two \$1,000 awards were paid out. The first honored 2008 winner Elizabeth Sunde, and the second went to 2009 winner James Bohnhoff. Contributions big and small from many LFA members enabled these and future awards. 
