A NEW DISCOVERY OF THE FIRST WIFE OF ROBERT LINNELL

In *The New England Historical and Genealogical Register* issue 170, pgs: 25–44, there is an excellent article written by Craig L. Dalley, called "**Religious and Political Radicalism in London: The Family of Thomas Howse, with Massachusetts connections, 1642–1665**". This article traces the roots of the Howse family before their migration to the New World and their association with the Puritan reformation in England.

According to Dalley, Robert Linnell had an association with the Howse family through Peninnah Howse, his second wife, both members of the Lothrop congregation. Dalley also states that John Bellamie, another member of the congregation, wrote a tract in 1646 in which he identifies Deacon Robert Linnell and his first wife, Susan. The information comes from a Baptismal record of their daughter, also named Susan, on Dec 7th, 1623 at Saint Andrew Hubbard Eastcheape.

Dalley further goes into detail connecting the tract to our Robert Linnell that came to America from mention of Bershuah, daughter of Daniel Ray, another Lothrop congregation member. Following is a transcript of the exact text that Dalley cited in his article.

"I fu•ther appeale for proofe of what I affirme, unto Mr. Henry Roborough, now one of the Scribes of the Assembly of Divines, and Pastor of Leonards E•st cheape London, whether hee hath not at that time observed that Mr. Jacob, and other knowne members of that Congregation, did usually communicate in the Ordin•nces of Christ in the publike Congregations: And whether hee hath not with his owne hands, administred the Lords Supper to Mr. Jacob, and other then knowne members of his Church. And that the members of this Congregation, did then not onely communicate in the publique Assemblies in the Sacrament of Baptisme, yea, that they did b•ptize

their owne children in the publique Assemblies; I appeale for the truth of this, unto the testimony of so many of them as bee now living, and remember the Churches practice in this particular at that time, and if there bee none now living that can remember, and will testifie this, then in particular I appeale to the Register Book of Andrew Hubbard London, whether upon the 7 of December, 1623. There was not then and there baptized, Susan the daughter of Robert Lynell, and of Susan his Wife, both which was then Parishioners of that Parish and members of this Congregation, and Robert Lynell Deacon of the Church. I fuother appeal unto the Regioner-book of Saviours Southwarke, whether

Regi••er-book of Saviours Southwarke, whether upon the third of February, 1624. there was not then and there baptized, B•rshua•, the daughter of Daniel Ray, who then was a Pa•ishioner of that Parish, and a member of this Congregation. I could produce many others in the like kind, but these may suffice to confirme the truth of what I affirme, neither would I have printed this, but for the witnesse of this truth, viz. That that Congre•ation did then ho•d it not onely lawfull, but of nec•ssity, upon pain of sin, •e•rding to the Printed Confession of Faith, to c•mmunicate in the publike Ministery and Ordin•nces, and that b•th of Baptisme and the Lord• Supper."*
