headstone for ancestor Samuel Linnell (1778-1847) who fought in the War of 1812 battle at Sackett's Harbor. He was captured and spent most of the war starving on a prison ship and in a Halifax POW camp. Your little organization paid to have the stone set in cement next to his wife Eunice Mosher Linnell at the Clayton Center Cemetery.

Lori and Jason worked on this for years and made a connection with the Jefferson County historian. Samuel's story has been published in their newsletter publication. The local team wanted to celebrate the stone placement, so nearby Fort Drum was contacted to see if they would send a flag folding team and play Taps. When the Army found out Samuel was a POW, they insisted on sending a minimum nine-man team to also provide a 21-gun salute!

The ceremony will be held at 11AM Saturday September 9 at the Clayton Center Cemetery (15650 County Rd 5, Clayton, NY 13624). Several of your servants on the steering committee plan to be there. This is a public event, and all are welcome. We would love to see you! RACHEL LINNELL WYNN (1918 – 2023)



Our life how short a groan a sigh
We live and then begin to die
But oh how great a mercy this
That death's a portal into bliss

How apropos the above as, with heavy hearts, we pay our respects to Rachel Linnell Wynn, who passed away on May 19, 2023 at the age of 104.

The poem may look familiar as it begins the preface for <u>The Descendants of Robert Linnell</u>, 2nd edition (DRL book). It is also engraved on Thankful Linnell's (d. Feb 20, 1831) gravestone. It was a chance reading of a newspaper article about the gravestone that provided the impetus for Rachel's research into our family.

A few short months ago, the December 2022 newsletter congratulated Rachel on reaching her 104th birthday, wishing her many more. We didn't really just wish them for her, we wanted them. Read the bottom line of the above poem one more time; Rachel is now in a state of eternal bliss. She has rejoined her husband, JC Wynn, never to be apart again. The heavy hearts are ours, always the case when loved ones leave us.

Let us pay our respects by celebrating her life and the immense gift she gave us all: the Linnell Family Association (LFA) and its

ever expanding connection with family. For anyone not fully aware, Rachel was unquestionably the force that developed the LFA. It was her desire to learn about the Linnell history that drove the genealogical research, publishing two editions of DRL book, establishing the LFA and our reunions. Naturally, she had help, lots of help over time, but make no mistake, Rachel was the force, our matriarch, our Grande Dame.

Of course, she was much more than her LFA persona. She was a daughter, sister, cousin, friend, aunt, niece, wife, mother, grandmother, teacher, guidance counselor, and on and on. We will miss her but never forget her. We pay our respects but not our last respects. The LFA and Rachel go hand in hand, we will write about her in future newsletters, talk about her in future reunions, remembering our sense of family came from her.

Editor's note: This is part two of a multi-part article on the life of our ancestor Robert Linnell leading up to his departure from England. The author is our historian Jason Jon Quick.

Review: In the first installment we learned what is known about Robert and his background in England. In this installment, we backup and learn what is known about the family of his wife Penninah. Penninah is mother of most known Linnells in America. She was a Howse.

The Howse Family and Their Connections to Robert

John Howse was a Curate at Edgerton, Kent 1592-1599, Rector, Eastwell, Kent 1603-1630. John's Patron in 1603 was Puritan supporter, Baronet Sir Moyle Finch of Eastwell, Kent. Moyle's brother, Henry Finch (1558-1625), of Whitefriars, Canterbury, later of Boxley, Kent was the chief puritan spokesman after the suppression of Wentwort, Finch had also studied at Christ's College, Cambridge, under Laurence Chaderton.

John died in Eastwell and all his children were also born in Kent. Unfortunately, his ancestry is unknown, and some speculate he was related to the Hulse family of Cheshire

and Kent. John was possibly a brother of Walter Howse, B.A. Christ's College Cambridge, Vicar of St Andrew's, Cambridge, and Rector of Little Bytham, Lincolnshire and of West Deeping, Lincolnshire. There is also a Howse family in the area of Kislingbury, Rothersthorpe, and Tiffield, Northamptonshire area that were wealthy yeoman around 1500 -1600.

2026 LINNELL FAMILY ASSOCIATION NATIONAL REUNION PART II - CHOOSING A REUNION LOCATION

(This is the second of two articles discussing the logistics of planning the next Linnell Family Association National Reunion. In Part I - Planning for the Next Reunion and Beyond, we reported on discussions that took place at the 2022 Reunion and asked for input and help in planning for the year 2026.)

What are some of the considerations when choosing a reunion location? No surprise here, the primary one is whether there is rich Linnell history nearby. We can't get any richer than Cape Cod, that's why we return so often. For those who like numbers, we've held 12 reunions total, with 5 on Cape Cod, or 42%. Minnesota is the only other state that has hosted more than one reunion. Shown below are the locations of past reunions, highlighted in the respective states.

How do we know where there is a rich amount of Linnell history? Obviously, one way is from hearing stories about northern, western, and southern movements of Linnell families, away from Cape Cod. Sadly, those great migrations happened many years ago and memories/stories have waned. Fortunately, a great way to find out about our heritage is via the LFA gathered documentation and genealogy data. Below is a picture from the April 1991 newsletter showing the general routes taken by the Linnells leaving Cape Cod, with intermediate stops.

We see the well-known routes from Cape Cod to Maine, New York, Ohio, Indiana, Michigan, Illinois, Wisconsin, Iowa, and Minnesota. The lesser known migrations moved from Pennsylvania to Kentucky, Tennessee, Virginia, and North Carolina.

Comparing the reunion and migration maps, we see the main locations from Cape Cod to Minnesota have hosted several reunions. The notable exception is Maine, rife with Linnell history, landmarks, and family sites to visit. Your Steering Committee is recommending we look at holding the 2029/2030 reunion in Maine, as we were just in the northeast last year.

No reunions have been held along the more southerly route. Tennessee, Kentucky, and North Carolina may all have a lot of Linnell history, with landmarks or former family sites to visit and learn about. With an eye towards increasing reunion attendance, maybe a slightly more centralized location, in an area we've never visited, will entice more cousins to participate.

Another consideration for choosing a location is the availability of other recreational areas or attractions. Kentucky and Tennessee are renowned for their abundance of opportunities for family fun. As is North Carolina, with widely diverse opportunities depending on whether we're near the Atlantic

coast or in the Blue Ridge Mountains. For future planning, we know Maine is rich in recreational areas and attractions.

Finally, we get to this article's main point – your Steering Committee needs your input! Are you interested in visiting our southern cousins? Does it matter if we went to Cape Cod in 2022 or is Maine still your location of choice? Are we remiss in not considering the Great Plains for 2026? Are you able to help coordinate the reunion?
